General Safety

Do not let anyone smoke near an oxygen cylinder when it is in use.

It is recommended that you regularly check your cylinder is full and that any connections and tubing are not damaged.

Content gauges identification

Please note when your cylinder is delivered it is full when the needle in the gauge is in the green sector. This is the pressure the cylinder was filled to, and due to external temperature changes the gauge will move within the green section.

Caution

If the contents gauge is showing red, your cylinder is empty and needs to be changed.

Use by dates

Our medical oxygen has a use by date of three years from the date of manufacture. This date is indicated on the batch sticker situated on the shoulder of each cylinder Please pay particular attention to this label.



Caution

Medical oxygen is not suitable for use after the date indicated.

How to Use Your Cylinder

1. How to attach a mask

Take the mask out of the packaging and attach it's tubing to the cylinder nozzle.



Turn the open/close valve in an anti-clockwise direction to turn the cylinder on.

3. How to select a flow rate

Turn the dial at the top of the cylinder to a suitable flow rate.

To do this, turn the dial until the required flow rate is displayed in the window.

4. How to turn the cylinder off

Set the flow rate to O using the dial at the top of the cylinder.

Rotate the open/close valve clockwise to turn the cylinder off.

5. How to put on the patient's mask

Put the mask over the patient's nose and mouth, slipping the strap behind the patient's head to secure the mask in place.
